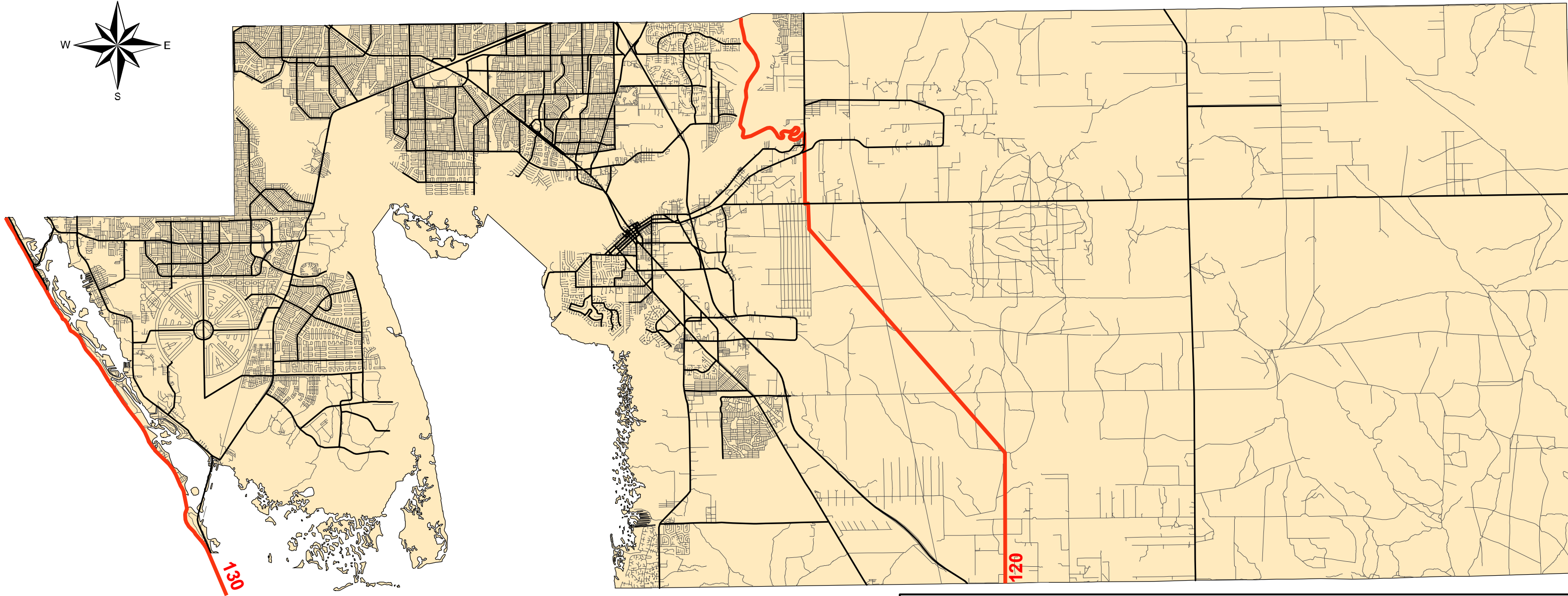
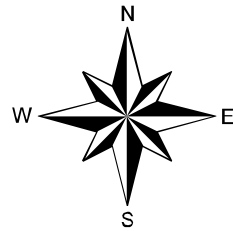

Charlotte County Wind Speed Line Description

Wind speed lines established.

(a) *Description of the 120-mile per hour wind speed line:* Commencing at the southeast corner of Township Forty-two South, Range Twenty-four East, said corner being on the Charlotte/Lee County line, thence north along the east line of said township, to the centerline of abandoned Seminole-Gulf Railroad right-of-way, thence northwesterly along the centerline of said railroad right-of-way to the intersection with the centerline of State Road Seventy-four, thence west along the centerline of said road to the southeast corner of Township Forty South, Range Twenty-three East, thence north along the east line of said township to the centerline of Shell Creek, thence meandering westerly,

downstream, along the centerline of said creek to the centerline of the Peace River, thence run northerly upstream along the centerline of the Peace River to the Charlotte/Desoto County line.

(b) *Description of the 130-mile per hour wind speed line:* Beginning at the intersection of the mean high water line of the Gulf of Mexico and the northern boundary of Charlotte County; thence southeasterly along the mean high water line of the Gulf of Mexico and extension thereof to the southern boundary of Charlotte County.
